



The Market Organization under the Ministry of the Interior's No Gift Policy commitment :
“Integrous and Transparent Ministry of Interior 2025” and “Refrain from Accepting or
Offering” Any Gifts of Any Kind Related to Official Duties. (No Gift Policy)

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I, Mr. Buranit Yuktanantana, Director of the Marketing Organization, hereby declare that all executives and government officials within the organization shall not accept any gifts or gratuities of any kind, whether prior to, during, or after the performance of their duties, which may lead to corruption or misconduct. They shall also refrain from soliciting or receiving any benefits arising from the execution of their official responsibilities. I further express my strong commitment to leading the personnel of the Marketing Organization in upholding the core institutions of the nation the Nation, Religion, and Monarchy and the constitutional democratic system with the King as Head of State. We shall adhere strictly to moral principles and ethical conduct, behave as responsible citizens, stand firm in doing what is right, prioritize the public interest over personal gain, and perform our duties promptly, responsively, and in accordance with the current situation. We are committed to serving the public with willingness, politeness, humility, and setting a positive example through our conduct. Our administration shall be guided by the principles of good governance integrity, honesty, transparency, and accountability. All personnel of the Marketing Organization, at every level, are expected to conduct themselves in accordance with these principles.

1. Refrain from persuading, offering, or accepting bribes, gifts, or all forms of rewards related to official duties.
2. Refrain from allowing or colluding with family members in offering or accepting bribes, gifts, or all forms of rewards from any person involved in official duties.
3. Perform all duties solely for the best interest and image of the government; avoid any action deemed as conflict of personal and public interests.
4. Minimize the offering and acceptance of property or other benefits given in good faith, in accordance with the criteria prescribed by the Office of the National Anti-Corruption Commission.
5. Uphold a zero-tolerance stance against the act of offering or accepting bribes, gifts, or all forms of rewards related to official duties, which may lead to corruption and misconduct.
